2. Was in charge of the development of tactical doctrine in the training and employment of dogs for use by the U.S. Army.

3. While Commanding Officer of the U.S. Army's 25th Infantry Scout Dog Platoon at Ford Ord, California, conducted training experiments involving over 500 separate tests dealing with:

Mine detection. The effect of "masking" odors on the dog's olfactory senses. Effects of distracting scents on properly motivated dogs. The dog's ability to detect the absence of earth.

4. Trained dogs with the following local regional dog clubs in Berlin, German: Boxer Club, German Shepherd Club, Watch and Protection Dog Club.

5. Consulted with and observed the olfactory experiments on dogs conducted by Professor Neuhaus of the University of Erlangen in Germany.

6. Consulted with and observed the Police Dog Training Division of the Metropolitan Police in London, England.

7. Observed and worked with: sentry dogs in Okinawa, the Philippines, and German; Police Dogs in Hong Kong, Atlanta, and Washington, D.C; guide doges in Germany, Holland,



and Belgium.

8. Have been awarded a lifetime membership in "Oldtimers of the Kennel World".
9. Conducted extensive experimental work in scouting, and research in dog behavior. Worked with Duke University's Para-psychology Laboratory in testing dogs for extra sensory perception.
10. Trained avalanche dogs, sled dogs, messenger dogs, bird, rabbit and varmini dogs, herd dogs, man trailers, guide dogs, attack dogs, scout dogs, estate dogs, etc
11. Conducted tests on the scenting ability of dogs in locating people buried under snow.
12. Conducted tests with scout dogs to determine the width of a scent cone at different ranges - done in Fort Benning Georgia (1960-1961). During this period, we made the initial investigation into the feasibility of using scout dogs in Viet Nam.
13. Worked on tracker dog training with Bloodhounds and German Shorthair Pointers.
14. From 1960 to date, have independently conducted tests in all phases of training dogs, developing techniques in training handlers, and teaching and training techniques for service dogs with multiple handlers. .
15. Established the "Dog Bite Fatality Committee" for the investigation of the circumstances and causes of human deaths attributed to dog bites.
16. Have written many articles on dogs and dog training published both in the United States and abroad. Author of the dog training section in the Encyclopedia Britannica.
17. I was a civilian consultant to the U.S. Army's Dog Breeding Program at Aberdeen Proving Grounds, Maryland. The program was officially known as the Bio-Sensor Program but it received the appellation "Super Dog Program" in the press. Dogs were trained for a wide variety of jobs including scout dogs, patrol dogs, explosive detector dogs, narcotic detector dogs, etc.
18. Former President of the Owner Handlers Association of America, a group of international membership that represented the interests of the dog show owner handlers.
19. Multiple winner of awards given by the Dog Writers Association of American in writing on dogs, their training and care.

21. Have conducted seminars and lectured on a wide variety of dog subjects with the emphasis on dog training throughout the world.
  22. While assigned as Dog Training Officer to the Infantry School at Ft. Benning, Georgia (1960), I developed a number of techniques in training dogs that were ultimately used in Viet Nam including an abbreviated five paragraph field order to be given by scout dog handlers to patrols they were accompanying. I further devised techniques for teaching scout dogs to locate explosives, mines, trip wires and punji pits. These added detection methods were used as an adjunct to their normal work and it expanded the usefulness of the scout dog program immensely.
  23. While at Ft. Ord, California (1956-1957), I did extensive experimentation with mine detector dogs and developed techniques for teaching the dog to detect the absence of earth. Work with mine dogs was the precursor of explosive detector dogs.
  24. Judged the First SchutzHund Trial in New York State.
  25. Developed and introduced many training techniques that are now widely accepted throughout the United States (list available on request).

31. I was on the Advisory Board of The Bide-A-Wee-Home, one of the country's most respected humane organizations.
32. I was on the Commission for Animal Education in the New York City school system. The Commission's duties are to recommend and aid in implementing courses of instruction dealing with animal care and husbandry in a wide range of courses offered by New York City's high schools. These courses are designed to prepare the students for careers in the animal care field. The Commission was also responsible for recommendations on implementing the law-required courses on humane education.
33. Trained the dog "Sandy" for the Broadway production of "Annie." In addition to choreographing the performance of the dog and developing cues for the dog to work off of, I also trained the owner/handler to train dogs. I also trained one of the back-up dogs for the show.
34. I bought and trained the dog for the South American production of "Annie" as well as the back-up dog. I also worked with the handler of the South American production of "Annie" and developed new and improved choreography for that production. Verbal cues and names were changed to fit in with the Spanish language.

44. The first amusement/theme park in the United States to use dogs for security was Freedomland in the Bronx, New York. I trained the men and dogs of Freedomland.
45. In 1983, I was one of the instructors in a seminar set up by the Palm Beach Sheriff's Department on the training of Police Dog and handlers. Nearly 100 police departments from the Southeast United States attended with their dogs and handlers. Instruction included bomb and drug detection.

47. Trained dogs for the Panamanian Defense Forces K-9 corps in September-October 1989 working with explosive detector dogs, narcotic detection dogs, and patrol dogs.
